



Bright and Breezy

Quilt Kit

Size 65" x 49"

This quilt is made up of 35 blocks and a small border.

Materials Needed

- 1m circle print feature
- 60cm plain orange
- 60cm plain green
- 30 cm orange spot
- 65cm stripe
- 50cm pink brocade
- 65cm green star

Other Supplies Needed

- Cutting board, patchwork ruler and rotary cutter
- sewing kit
- cotton

Please read through all the instructions before you begin to sew.

Please do not wash your fabric before you sew.

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances unless otherwise stated.

As you sew, press all seams closed and to one side

Cutting Instructions

- Take the circle feature fabric and cut 6 x 3" strips across the fabric (ie from selvedge to selvedge). This will be your border.
- Take your stripe fabric and cut 6 x 2½" strips across the fabric. This will be your binding.
- The quilt is made of 2 different blocks:

Block A = Cut 21 x 9" squares in the following colors:

6 x circle print

1 x plain orange

1 x plain green

3 x orange spot

3 x stripe

3 x pink brocade

4 x green star

Block B = This block is made of two colors – one color in the centre and an alternate color around the edge.

For each block cut :

1 (3" x 3") square (this is the block centre piece)

2 (3" x 3½") strips

2 (3½" x 9") strips

Use the remaining fabric you have to cut 14 of these blocks. You can copy my color combinations using Diagram 1. as your guide or you can choose your own color combinations.

Sewing

Block B

Take your centre square and attach your 3" x 3½" strips . Place each on opposite sides of your square. Then attach the 3½" x 9" strips to the remaining two sides of the square. See diagram 2.

The block will now be 9" square. Make a total of 14 of these blocks.

Putting It Together

Use Diagram 1. to guide you with your block placement. Sew the blocks into rows of five. (this will make 7 rows). Then sew the rows together to form the centre of your quilt.

Border

Take the strips of border fabric that you cut earlier. You will then need to join the strips of fabric together and trim so that you have 4 strips long enough to sew to the quilt as your border. Sew these strips to the edge of your quilt top to form the border.

Layering and Quilting

Use your preferred method to layer, baste and quilt your quilt top.

Binding

After you have quilted your top you will then need to join the binding strips together in order to bind your quilt.

Join the strips with bias joins to make one long strip. Press the binding in half lengthwise with the wrong sides together. Trim the excess batting and backing from the quilt. With the raw edges together and right sides facing each other, sew the binding to the quilt (use a walking foot on your machine to do this). Form a mitre at each corner of the quilt as you sew. Fold the binding to the back and hand sew the folded edge in place.
